hat a great definition and something that we hear about often: Legos, puzzles, Velcro, extension cords, ice cream on our taste buds, two pieces of paper, paper chains, mustard on a corn dog, and spark plug cables. When things like these get disconnected, we can and often do get so frustrated. The connection is vital to things looking correct and working.

Society speaks often about the value of being connected to people. Commercials share about airlines, phones, social media, and events that can help us connected. Our minds and hearts long for being connected, but yet we often don't always know how. Taking that first step can be difficult, because we don't know where it might lead (which is really growth and transparency - that we admire from afar and yet stay away from still.) I truly want to encourage the idea of taking a step of connectivity, or if you are connected well to continue and know of other opportunities.

Connecting with God - Here are three keys -

- One, making Sunday Worship attendance a priority.
- Two, set aside time to spend with God each day.
- Three, meeting with a small group of people to learn and walk through life together.

In this issue of Life @ Lincoln, there are many opportunities to be in a group of believers growing together, learning from each other, encouraging each other.

Certainly there are accidental connections and they are awkward: sap on your car, gum on your shoe, a pocket phone call, a car accident, etc. BUT the connections we want in life are almost always Intentional. I encourage you to take the time to make a regular connection with God, the Body of Christ and a small group of believers. God encourages it. One example of this is in Hebrews 10:24-25

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, and let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

It is appreciated when it happens, and yet we mhave a tendency to postpone taking the initiative in our connection with God and others.






# **Nominating Committee Message**

Greetings from the LPC Nominating Committee of 2025! We are making good progress with our work to obtain nominations for the positions of Deacons and Elders for the class of 2027 and 2028 respectively. We have received nominations from people who recognize a heart for service and leadership in fellow church members and have submitted their names.

What if you see those same qualities in yourself and you would like to nominate yourself to serve as a Deacon or Elder? We encourage you to do it. Don't pass up the opportunity to contribute to the very ministries of our church that you enjoy as a member. If you feel called to serve as a Deacon or Elder we want to hear from you.

Elders, together with the Pastors, lead and direct the ministries of the church. They are persons of faith, dedication and good judgment. Elders serve on Session, the governing body of the church. They also chair various church commissions through which our ministries are conducted. Twelve Elders are ordained to serve a three-year term.

Deacons are leaders who serve as the caring, compassionate arm of the church, providing loving support to all those in need within the church community. The primary area of service is the care of members, especially in prayer. Fifteen to eighteen Deacons are ordained to serve a two-year term.

Nomination forms are located at the welcome desk in the lobby of the sanctuary. Forms may be given to the church office (sealed in envelope) or to one of the Nominating Committee members as listed on the bottom of the form, or emailed to Duffy Ruffin at duffygr@comcast.net. These forms need to be returned to the Committee by September 30, 2025. You may put it in the offering boxes, mail or drop it by the church office in a sealed envelope.

We thank you for your prayerful nomination of a candidate, whether you nominate yourself or a church friend, and the church as a whole is the beneficiary. You are welcome to pose questions to the Nominating Committee: Duffy Ruffin, Tom Beck, Nancy Kaneko, Sandy Evans, Cindy Wong and Ann Wunsch.

incoln Church has two YouVersion groups (one for men and one for women) that meet daily in the YouVersion App. This allows you to participate in the study each day at a time and place that is convenient for you. How can that be you say? Simply open the app each day and read the plan that the facilitator previously sent out.

The study has a devotional/teaching part that you read or maybe watch a video, and then you read Scriptures that pertain to that days study. Once done with that, you will see a section that allows for individual participation. Participants can comment on what God showed them and how God impacted their life with that days reading. (You are NOT obligated to make a comment!) People learn so much from the comments and they build a strong community together to support in prayer as well.

This is the perfect blend of technology and Scripture reading that fits into your daily rhythm. Click the Join Now Button to become part of the group.

If you don't already have the YouVersion Bible App, download it now here (<a href="https://www.bible.com/app">https://www.bible.com/app</a>).

The group facilitator must first invite you to join the group in YouVersion Bible App. Once invited, you accept the invitation and you are ready to go.



One of the luxuries of living in our wealthy country is being able not only to enjoy hearty meals, but to have leftovers the next day. Sometimes these taste even better the second time around. While anyone can bring out and serve leftovers, it's amazing what good, creative cooks can do to whip up something fresh and new using what was part of yesterday's meal. Some of the cooking shows even feature youngsters displaying their culinary skills by creating dishes out of limited resources, proving that amazing transformations can take place in the hands of a master artisan.

Jesus is the Master Artisan who invites us to bring our "leftovers" to Him for recreation. What are the fragments left behind when we are bereft of loving relationships, hopes and dreams yet unfulfilled, losses brought about by poor health and/or old age? Jesus sees the possibilities if we are willing to surrender to Him whatever we have left. For as the song writer says, "Little Is Much When God Is In It." Any unfinished business left over from last year? Make this a year of accountability to self and others. As Christ took the five loaves and two fish and multiplied them, He wants to multiply our bits and pieces of life to His own glory. Looking back on painful experiences can have value for lessons learned, such as compassion for others in similar circumstances, so all is not lost if God uses us to minister comfort to others with a testimony of how God showed up. No time for personal devotions or prayer? Fragments of time throughout the day can become precious prayer times, such as on that drive to work. An entire chapter of scripture may be difficult to recall, but the Holy Spirit can bring one word, verse or phrase to mind at just the moment it is needed. Just can't do what you used to do? Hosting a small group or mentoring a young Believer may be a new calling in your new season of life.

Remember: the smaller the fragment, the greater God's glory as He takes it, blesses it, multiplies and distributes it to enrich your own life and the life of others.
