
So as you look ahead to this year, how will you be intentional about who you are following each day? How will you take hold of the power of choice and respond to what Jesus is calling you to?





Daily Word of Encouragement

GOOD GRIEF

"...after the fire came a gentle whisper"

I Kings 19:12

eing the optimist that I am, I originally thought the title was going to be unique to this devotional, but I soon discovered that at least one other author has used it before. Granger E. Westberg, a Lutheran clergyman and professor, wrote a still popular book of this title in 1962 as he studied the grief process. He observed that in going through a significant grief experience we come out of it as different people: "Depending on the way we respond to this event, we are either stronger people than we were before, or weaker; either healthier in spirit or sicker." Those of us who are Christians know that religious faith developed when times are good, matures and assures us that we are not alone now or in the future, for God is with us and God is good.

In light of a number of death notices recently, I have been thinking of the "upside" of grief in the life of believers. First, different types of grief occur in life. To become part of the family of God requires confessing and repenting of personal sin with godly sorrow. But being a follower of Jesus Christ does not



spare us from also grieving the loss of health, or independence due to aging, family relationships, jobs and friends. With God's help, we can face loss, endure suffering, find gain insight, develop spiritual healing. maturity, grow in strength, and finally help ourselves and others move forward. Many examples of this appear in the Bible, such as Job ultimately concluding, "I know that my Redeemer lives...in my flesh I shall see God...I myself..." (Job 19:25-27). The fiery testing of his faith had not destroyed Job's trust in God. Another example is David grieving the death of his son in 2 Samuel 12:15-23 and showing acceptance: "Then David got up from the ground. After he had washed, put

on lotions and changed his clothes, he went into the house of the Lord and worshiped..."How could he "get up"? Because he found comfort in this assurance: "I shall go to him, but he shall not return to me" (v.22).

The key is to grieve with God, Who grieves with us (Lam. 19-25). I am reminded of the funeral of my nephew, Michael, a Marine vet. The military portion of the service was held outside in front of the church. At its conclusion, the family and guests followed the casket into the sanctuary continuation of the service, with the pastor leading the procession and quoting one scripture after another from both Old and in New Testaments а resonating. authoritative voice: Ps. 23, 90, 91, 121; I Cor.15; Rom.8; John 14; Rev.21, 22 — so deeply moving! God's Word seemed to be charging the air! The message clearly was that through faith, hope overcomes despair and light overcomes darkness.

The Apostle's Creed expresses the reality that life is not ended but transformed in death. In November we celebrated All Saints Day on the 1st, celebrating saints of the Church, known and unknown, followed the next day by All Souls Day, in remembrance of all those no longer living. A hymn by William W. How reminds us that we are as believers in Jesus Christ all saints, standing clothed in

His righteousness. Hebrews 11 is the "Hall of Faith" chapter listing past saints who are commended for their faith and Hebrews 12 follows with the charge for those still living to "run with perseverance the race marked out for us" for we are "surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses." How's hymn was originally 11 stanza's long. Here are three:

For all the saints, who from their labours rest, Who Thee by faith before the world confessed, Thy Name, O Jesu, be forever blessed. Alleluia, Alleluia!

O may Thy soldiers, faithful, true and bold, Fight as the saints who nobly fought of old, And win with them the victor's crown of gold. Alleluia, Alleluia!

O blest communion, fellowship divine! We feebly struggle, they in glory shine; Yet all are one in Thee, for all are Thine. Alleluia, Alleluia!





Maybe you've heard about God. Maybe you wonder if He is real Maybe you wonder if He knows about you or if He cares about you. We believe that God has given us answers to these important questions in His word. We would love to help you enter a personal relationship with God. You were made for this personal relationship with God. Receive God's invitation to come and see.

Truth Number One - God knows who you are and loves you.

Did you know that God loves you? Take a moment to really think about that statement-God loves you. Regardless of your age, background, race, past failures, or any other aspect of your life, He deeply cares about you and is personally aware of all that is going on in your life. In short, God has an incredible love for you and wants more than anything else to have a genuine, personal relationship with you that can last forever. Romans 5:8 "But God showed His great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners."

Truth Number Two - Sin has separated you from God.

You have a problem; in fact, we all have it. We have broken God's commands. The Bible calls this sin. In Romans 3:23, it specifically says "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard." Have you ever lied, stolen, or thought a wrong thought? Each of these actions break a command of God. Looking honestly into our own hearts reveals the truth - we have all committed sin. And sin has devastating Consequences - eternal separation from God, which the Bible refers to as spiritual death. Isaiah 59:2, "It's your sins that have cut you off from God..."

Truth Number Three - You cannot earn or repair your relationship with God by your own effort.

No quality of morality or good deeds can bridge the gap to God. Most people think if they do enough good things in their life it will eventually earn them a home in heaven with God. But the Bible says in Proverbs 14:12 "There is a path before each person that seems right, but it ends in death."

Truth Number Four - Jesus Christ is the only way to know God.

Jesus Christ is just as much God as God the Father is , yet. He came to earth and lived a human life. Jesus faced all the trials and temptations that we face but never sinned. He voluntarily died on the cross, having nothing wrong, there He finished His greatest work. He paid for your sin. Then three days later, He would rise from; the dead, proving to all that He truly was God. John.14:6, "Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No One can come to God except through me."

Truth Number Five - You must place your faith & trust in Jesus Christ.

God wants to have a relationship with you through His Son, Jesus Christ. He wants to take your sinful heart and transform it permanently. Today, will you choose to believe in Christ? Right now you can pray and ask God to forgive you of your sin. All you need to do is put your faith and trust in Jesus Christ, believing He alone can save you. John 3:16, "For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have everlasting life.
