Many people ask children what they want to be when they grow up. The most common

answer I heard as a child was a fireman or a policeman from the boys and a nurse or a teacher from the girls. Then in 4th grade, my teacher asked the class to write an essay about what they might want to do for work someday.

My best friend wrote his essay about being a civil engineer. I didn't even know what one was, but he was my best friend and so I wrote about the same thing. I was happy and my friend was happy - so I thought it was a good essay. Careers are important choices, because they have the power to influence a certain level of happiness, contentment, frustration, financial power, and even joy. Why is that? Part of the answer is we often

find our identity more in what we do than in who we are. In the middle of a project, some can't seem to focus. They don't complete much work and generally get little done. There are others whose mode of operation is

procrastination. They have great difficulty in finishing the assignment. Procrastination will also prevent some from starting new

endeavors. These thoughts are about what we do. We all have a need to correctly think about "getting started" on something and "Improving something." One is about the beginning and initially doing something and the other is about focusing on a final product. All of this is true in our journey with Jesus Christ.

Here is the key thought; if you have not begun a relationship with Jesus - today is a great day to get started. 2 Corinthians 6:2 says, "...I tell you, now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation."

Today is a great day to start your relationship with Jesus Christ. Pray to Him and admit your struggle with sin, and as Romans 10:9 says, "If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." What people do in their jobs is important, but the reality of being saved is eternal and we want to encourage people to confess and believe as this verse says. One of the things that I love about being here at Lincoln is the freedom we have to share this good news. It is my prayer that our presence in life, the choices we make, and the words we use will encourage people to see our peace and cause them to consider Jesus and eventually "confess with their mouth" and "believe in their heart." Let's continue praying for those who don't yet know the Lord.

## DETAILS FROM THE 2024 NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Greetings from the LPC Nominating Committee of 2024! We have begun our work to select candidates for the positions of Deacons and Elders for the class of 2026 and 2027 respectively. We invite your input in the process by submitting names for the Nominating Committee to consider. Please pray for a fellow church member(s) to come to mind that you observe has a heart for service and loves to bring people closer to faith in Jesus Christ.

Elders, together with the pastors, lead and direct the ministry of the church. They are persons of faith, dedication and good judgment. Elders serve on Session, the governing body of the church. They also chair various church teams through which all ministries are conducted. Twelve Elders are ordained to serve a three-year term.

Deacons, as set forth in scripture, are leaders who serve as the caring, compassionate arm of the church, providing loving support to all those in need within the church community. The primary area of service is the care of members. Ten to eighteen Deacons are ordained to serve a two-year term.

You will find nomination forms in the narthex at the information booth. Forms may be given to the church office (sealed in envelope) or to one of the Nominating Committee members as listed on the bottom of the form, or emailed to Duffy Ruffin at duffygr@comcast.net. These forms need to be returned to the Committee by September 15, 2024. You may put it in the offering boxes, mail or drop it by the church office in sealed envelope.

At the end of June we are 50% into the year and have received 53% of the projected income for the year and expended 46% of projected expenses for 2024. This leaves a positive balance of \$63,320. We also have \$35,281 in the Future Capital Projects

Fund and \$40,000 in the Major Maintenance Fund. In addition we have received contributions for the Children's playground and will be able to fund the total project including artificial turf rather than grass. God is good!


