April/May Financial Report



At the end of April we are 33% into the year and have received 35% of the projected income for the year and expended 31% of projected expenses for

2024. This leaves a positive balance of \$36,435. We also have \$33,416 in the Future Capital Projects Fund and \$40,000 in the Major Maintenance Fund. In addition we have received contributions for the Children's playground and will be able to fund the total project. God is good!

We ended May in the positive with \$32,572 and are at 43% of projected income for the year after 42% of the year. We have \$34,611 in the Future Capital Projects Fund. We are right on target. Thank you for your continued support of LPC.


